

CaribData Data Sharing Survey



"Assessing attitudes and practices to data handling and sharing in the Caribbean".

Purpose of the research

We want to better understand how researchers manage, and particularly share, their research data. Using an online survey, we will ask you a series of short questions on your practices and attitudes related to sharing research data. You must be at least 18 years old to participate.

How long will the survey take?

The survey should take between 5 and 10 minutes, and you don't need to complete the questionnaire all in one go.

Who can take part?

If you work with data, you're views are important to us.

How can I access the survey?

If I don't want to finish the survey, what do I do?

Your participation in this survey is voluntary. You can leave any question blank, and can end the survey at any time. If you decide to end the survey, close your browser window.

How do we keep your data secure?

The information that we collect from you will be kept strictly confidential. Your data are collected via an encrypted web link. When your data arrives at our server it stays encrypted. We monitor our server continually for potential security breaches. Your data will only be accessible to the UWI research team, and we will aggregate all data before reporting study results.

Can I find out more about your work?

At CaribData, we are building facilities to help with Research Data Handling. And we are working to better understand attitudes and practises related to research data usage in the Caribbean. If you would like to find out more about our work, there is an optional space to leave your email address during the survey. We can then email you a newsletter with our results.
